Why See an Orthodontist?

Orthodontists are dental specialists. Upon dental school graduation, they continue their full-time university-based education for an additional two to three years before they become a certified practitioner of orthodontics. Studying tooth movement (orthodontics) and guidance of facial development (dentofacial orthogodics), orthodontists are uniquely educated dental experts who solely straighten teeth and align jaws.

Orthodontists diagnose, prevent and treat dental and facial irregularities. Concentrating strictly on orthodontics and dentofacial orthopedics, allows orthodontists to become highly skilled in this dental specialty. No matter the age, orthodontics can protect your bite (occlusion), maximize your teeth's effectiveness in performing their functions and create a well-aligned smile.

How Orthodontic Treatment Works

Orthodontic appliances come in a variety of materials including metal, ceramic or plastic. They can be removable or they may be bonded to the teeth. Brackets can be wire or clear with colorful ties to show your personality or school spirit. A carefully controlled, constant, gentle force is exerted by braces to slowly move teeth to a corrected position in order to achieve an optimum bite, thereby improving the patient's appearance and health.

Appliances Utilized in Treatment

Dr. Gamm chooses treatment appliances based on his experience dealing with cases of almost every type and complexity in over fifteen years of practice. This performance knowledge allows him to choose appliances that excel in quality, comfort, effectiveness and efficiency in correcting orthodontic problems.

How Long Does Treatment Last?
